History of Juneteenth

June 19, 1865, in Galvenston, Texas, where they freed the last slaves left in America exactly two years after the Emancipation Proclamation. General Gordan Granger brought that message to the south.

Racial equality as well as racial reconciliation.

In the late 1800's, Juneteenth was as big as July 4th. Fireworks, dignitaries, elected officials. Sing songs, play music, play sports. A day of great jubilation. They actually called the first Juneteenth ever Jubilee. From there, though, was Jim Crow and nativism and imperialism and Juneteenth got suppressed. African Americans were actually shamed for celebrating Juneteenth. Today is the first bill for it to be a holiday since 1983, when they signed MLK day into law. A lot of the traditions in Detroit, festivals and such, started centered around Juneteenth. We do want a call to action after this meeting, and it may be uncomfortable. Things are still happening in our backyard. We also need to discuss Black Wall Street and what happened there. Our history of a slaughter of Black Americans. Over 300 African Americans were killed and all their businesses and homes were destroyed.
