

Meeting Minutes, May 18, 2023

- I. Welcome New Members: Mary Ann Fontana, filling in for Glenda Stainback as she recovers more fully, called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM and then welcomed new members and especially John Conyers III, who is running for Congress, challenging Shri Thanedar: ConyersforCongress.com; jc3@conyersforcongress.com

- IV. State of our Public Schools, discussion moderated by Barry Lepler: Ferndale Schools Superintendent, Dr. Bobbie Hayes Goodrum: Bobbie was a special education specialist with previous administrative and leadership experience in California. She is especially proud of the passage of a bond to offer more opportunities with regard to facilities, arts, academics, athletics, acceptance, and more.; and greater diversity within the district; faculty and staff commitment. Challenges include budget, adequate funding, cost of living increases, polarizing politics, and creating more diversity as students need to be able to see themselves in their educators.

Berkley Schools Superintendent, Scott Francis: Scott was a special education teacher with Troy district administrative experience over curriculum during the pandemic. He is especially proud of what the staff provides for the students; extra- curricular activities and academics; parent involvement; funding opportunities, including for new technologies. Challenges include the budget, adequate funding, and the social and emotional well-being of students.

Oak Park Schools Superintendent, Angel Abdulahad: Angel came from Iraq to the US in 1982 and settled in Oak Park. He has held several positions, including as superintendent of the Madison Heights District, leading to his current one. He is especially proud of the facilities available for students, the excellent teachers, and the quality of

instruction. Challenges include ways that the school districts can collaborate, budget, greater funding for teachers, and teacher shortage.

Rep. Natalie Price: priorities include universal free breakfasts and lunches in schools; accessible five-day a week pre-school at state level. We have educators making decisions about education, and that is ideal.

Greg Humphries, for Rep. **Helena Scott**: she is the chair of the Energy Committee, which is developing a task force for dependable energy; she has created bill that makes it possible for kids to be tested for lead.

Mayor Marian McClellan, Oak Park: she is running for mayor again, unopposed; there are two open Council seats with 3 running; a zoning change has been good for business; improvements in park areas are great for residents; there are more and more OP restaurants; Jack Lessenberry is completing the OP book that Marian's late husband Keith was working on.
